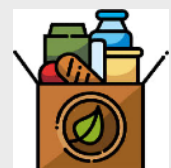

Londonderry Selectboard Hearing 7/6/26 at 6:00 PM

The Londonderry Selectboard will meet on July 6, 2026, at the Londonderry Town Offices to solicit comments from the public on a proposed zoning bylaw amendment and a new zoning map. This amendment will change the zoning regulations for the entire town of Londonderry. It is designed to:

- align the town's zoning regulations with the planning goals in the Town Plan,
- addresses inconsistencies resulting from the many changes that have been made to state statutes since the zoning bylaws were last updated,
- fix shortcomings of the current regulations that had resulted in confusion or difficulties for applicants, the Administrative Officer, and the Development Review Board over the years,

The full text of the proposed amendment and the new zoning map are posted on the Planning Commission page of the Londonderry Web site, and paper copies are available for twenty dollars from the town clerk.

The table of contents of this proposed zoning bylaw includes: General Standards, Exemptions and Limitations, Prior Applications, Approvals and Uses, Nonconformities, Zoning Districts, General Zoning Rules, Site Design and Performance Standards For Commercial and Multi-Unit Housing Developments, Specific Use Standards, Subdivision Standards, Planned Unit Development (PUD) Standards, Administration and Enforcement, Fees and Filing Requirements, Zoning Permits, Commercial and Multifamily Home Development, Appeals, Notice Requirements, Hearings and Decisions, Violations and Penalties, and Definitions.

Bone Builders will Continue!

We are posting to clarify a very recent decision by the federal government and its effects here in the Mountain Towns.

You may have heard in the last 24 hours that the RSVP (Retired Seniors Volunteer Program) based at the Southwest Council on Aging and funded through Americorps has been suddenly defunded by the federal government, and will shut down effective July 1. One of the most well-known RSVP programs was Bone Builders, a popular volunteer-led exercise class among seniors. We have four such sessions each week here in Londonderry, with others nearby at the Winhall Community Arts Center and the First Unitarian-Universalist Church in Chester.

The Bone Builders program, however, is not “owned” by RSVP or Americorps – it was created by Tufts University and has been made available by them to any organization seeking to implement it.

Neighborhood Connections is dedicated to ensuring that this program remains available in our area, uninterrupted, and will directly sponsor and as necessary, fund its continuation into the future. We are grateful for the volunteer leaders who dedicate many hours each week, and will continue to look forward to seeing our participants!

Neighborhood Connections Plans Events for Caregivers

Those with Dementia Neighborhood Connections is excited to serve members of our community who are caregivers working with loved ones experiencing memory challenges or a diagnosis of dementia or related disorders. Our initial programming is a group format for caregiver support and for participant engagement, modelled after existing successful programs. The group, called “Remembering Together,” will meet every other week on Thursdays for two hours between 11:00 am and 1:00 pm. Scheduled meetings are July 16, July 30, August 3, and August 27th. During this time, special activities, including music, will be held with those experiencing cognitive changes, while caregivers will meet in an adjoining room to share experiences and challenges, drawing support and ideas from each other. You may participate in one, several, or all four sessions.

Both groups will be guided by experienced staff. It will be led by Neighborhood Connections staff member Lois Schram Osnow, a licensed clinical social worker with an extensive background in gerontology. Prior to moving to Vermont, she was co-founder and owner of LS Gerontology Seminars, founded in 2002, where she instituted culture change projects in more than 25 long-term care facilities in the tri-state area.

The sessions will be held at our meeting facilities in the Mountain Marketplace, on the corner of Routes 11 and 100 in Londonderry. A light lunch will be included. There is no charge for lunch or the event. Please reserve a seat ahead of time by calling Lois at (802) 824-4343 or to request more information.



Thrifty Attic

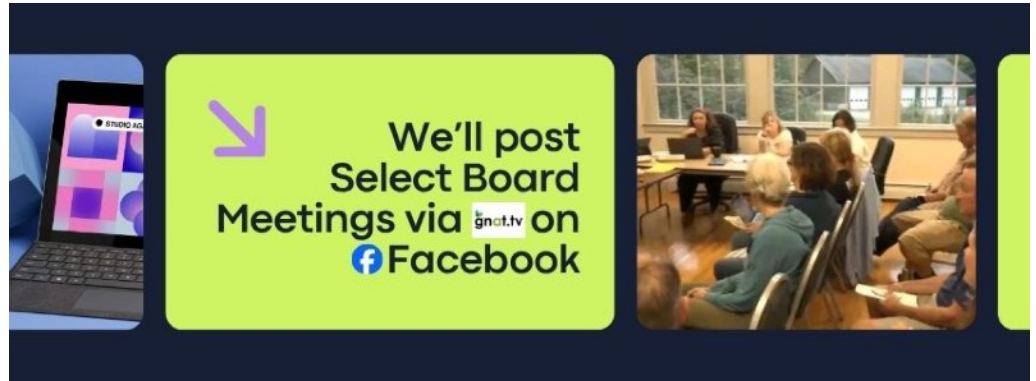

Community members, local leaders, and healthcare advocates gathered on Saturday, June 20, to celebrate a half-century of dedicated service at the Mountain Valley Health Center's 50th Birthday Bash. Held from 11:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m., the afternoon offered attendees a wonderful opportunity to reminisce, share stories, and celebrate everything this small but mighty clinic has accomplished since its beginnings in 1979.

The anniversary event was generously supported by The Mountain Valley Health Council and through the donations of area businesses and civic organizations. Guests enjoyed hot dogs and water donated by the Wantastiquet Rotary Club, an array of cookies donated by Grandma Miller's, vegetables and hummus donated by The Corner Market and Deli, and ice cream from JC's Market and Deli. 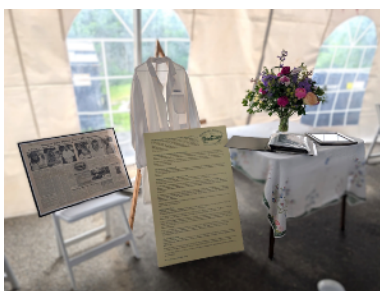
The speaking program featured local leaders and health center founders who spoke about the health center's history and its impact on the community.

VT-ALERT is used by the state and local responders to notify the public of emergency situations. **Those include, but are not limited to, evacuation information; chemical spills; shelter-in-place alerts; severe weather advisories; boil water advisories; and roadway interruptions.** Residents can tailor the alerts to specific locations, types of alerts, and on which devices they will be notified.

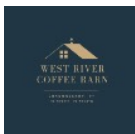

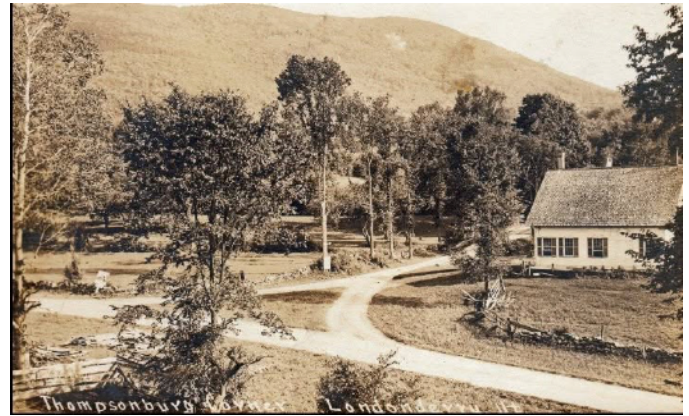
