Tai Chi for Falls Prevention - Do you worry about falling? The fear of falling often results in more falls; hence, confidence in “not falling” helps reduce these incidents. Tai Chi is a gentle movement exercise that improves balance by strengthening muscles and coordination. With regular practice, tai chi is a highly effective exercise for fall prevention. All of our instructors are certified through Tai Chi Vermont.

Bone Builders - The RSVP Bone Builders Osteoporosis Prevention and Reversal Program is an effective combination of weight bearing, balance and stretching exercises. Living with Black Bears

It's that time of year, Vermont! We're getting reports of bears waking up and leaving their dens all over the state, which means it's time to take down those birdfeeders and bearproof your yard.

While early April is traditionally thought of as bear-aware time, shorter winters mean bears emerge from their dens earlier in the spring. Don't wait until a bear comes to visit your property to take steps to prevent a bear incident. Here are some steps you can take now to help teach bears, and other wildlife like raccoons, skunks and rodents, that our yards and neighborhoods are not where they should come looking for a snack:

- Take down your birdfeeders until next winter
- Keep your garbage in bear-resistant containers or structures. You can contact your waste hauler to see about getting a bear-resistant dumpster!
- Get your chickens and bees behind electric fencing or a bear-proof enclosure to keep them safe

Grace Cottage Wins “Best Place to Work” Award Again

TOWNSHEND – For the fourth year in a row, Grace Cottage Family Health & Hospital has been named one of Vermont’s “Best Places to Work” by the Vermont Business Magazine. Grace Cottage is the only hospital in the state to have achieved this award each year for the past four years.

The award, given each year by Vermont Business Magazine and the Vermont Chamber of Commerce, in partnership with the Society for Human Resource Management, the Vermont State Council, the Vermont Department of Commerce and Community Development, and Workforce Research Group, is designed to identify, recognize and honor the best places of employment in Vermont, benefiting the state's economy, workforce, and businesses.

Companies from across the state entered the contest’s two-part process to determine the Best Places to Work in Vermont. First, each company was evaluated for its workplace policies, practices, and demographics. This part of the process was worth approximately 20% of the total evaluation. The second part consisted of an anonymous employee survey to measure the employee experience, with this score worth approximately 80% of the total evaluation.

The Best Places to Work contest includes three categories: Small Businesses (15-99 employees), Medium Businesses (100-249 employees), and Large Businesses (250+ employees). Grace Cottage won in the Medium Business Category.

The final rankings for each category will be announced at a special awards presentation on April 2 in Burlington.

Located in Townshend, Grace Cottage Family Health & Hospital employs approximately 245 people and includes a 19-bed Critical Access Hospital (24/7 emergency care, inpatient acute care, skilled rehabilitation, lab, and diagnostic imaging); an outpatient rehabilitation department (physical and occupational therapy); a Rural Health Clinic providing primary care and mental health services; and a retail pharmacy. VT-ALERT is used by the state and local responders to notify the public of emergency situations. **Those include, but are not limited to, evacuation information; chemical spills; shelter-in-place alerts; severe weather advisories; boil water advisories; and roadway interruptions.** Residents can tailor the alerts to specific locations, types of alerts, and on which devices they will be notified.

YES, MUD SEASON IS A THING.

As the snow retreats, here's how to be prepared to welcome in the mud.

- Mud seasons typically runs from March to May, as the snow melts and until stronger sunlight is able to dry things out.
- Hiking trails become vulnerable to erosion during this time, so check for trail closures before your next hiking trip.
- Dirt roads can also become challenging during mud season so expect new potholes and drive carefully.
- Trade in your warm winter boots for water-proof foot gear, such as duck boots or water-proof rain boots.
- Peak activity for newborn wildlife also happens during this time, so also get your binoculars ready.
- Lastly, have fun and embrace the mud.

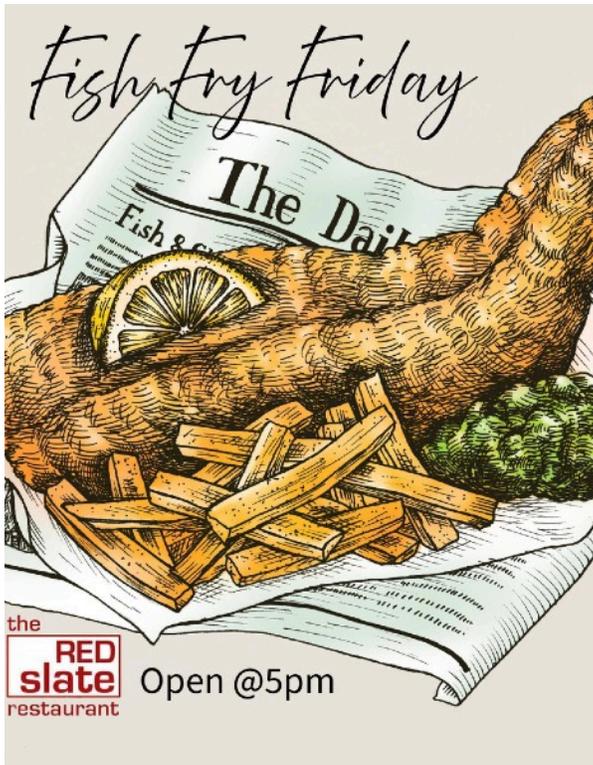

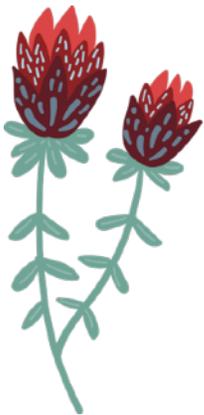

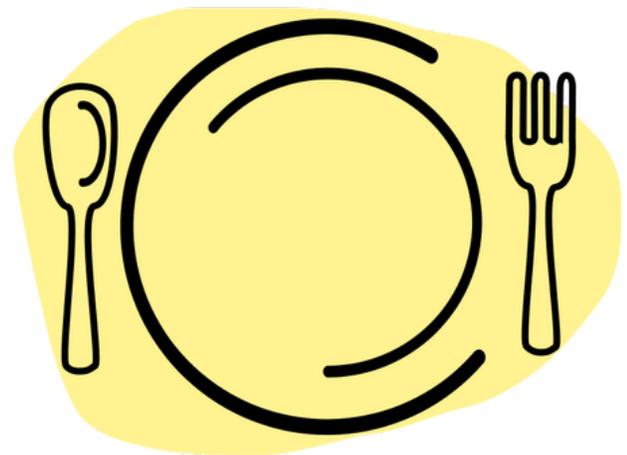
