Wellness Classes

Tai Chi for Falls Prevention - Do you worry about falling? The fear of falling often results in more falls; hence, confidence in “not falling” helps reduce these incidents. Tai Chi is a gentle movement exercise that improves balance by strengthening muscles and coordination. With regular practice, tai chi is a highly effective exercise for fall prevention. All of our instructors are certified through Tai Chi Vermont.

Bone Builders - The RSVP Bone Builders Osteoporosis Prevention and Reversal Program is an effective combination of weight bearing, balance and stretching exercises. Bone Builders is a free, ongoing program with a choice of morning or afternoon classes. Group classes include standing and sitting exercises using light hand weights.

Walk with Ease – Walk with Ease is an evidence-based Wellness Program developed by the Arthritis Foundation. It uses the simple activity of walking to improve health and well-being, and is good for nearly everyone, from absolute beginners to people who have been active for years. This is a year-round program, with walks outdoors in pleasant weather, and indoors in the winter courtesy of our partnership with the Chris Lewit Tennis Academy.





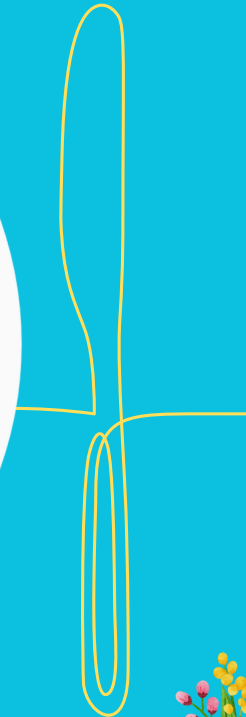

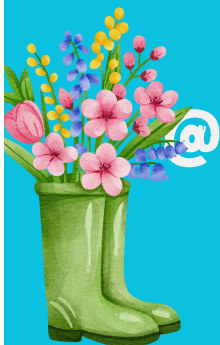

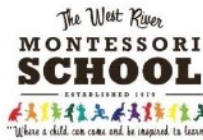

Tiny Tip for Recycling: You can recycle film plastic at special collection sites throughout the state.

or find your local resources at www.802Recycles.com

What's film plastic? Think stretchy plastic like grocery bags. Also clean and dry:
Bubble wrap
Shipping envelopes (no silver or paper coating)
Stretch film/Shrink wrap
six-pack rings

Bags:
bread
newspaper
produce
dry cleaning
carry out
Ziplock style
case wrap (like around toilet paper)

No frozen food bags. No compostable plastic. Nothing that "crinkles" instead of stretches.

Never put film plastic in blue-bin mixed single stream recycling--it clogs up the works at the recycling facilities!

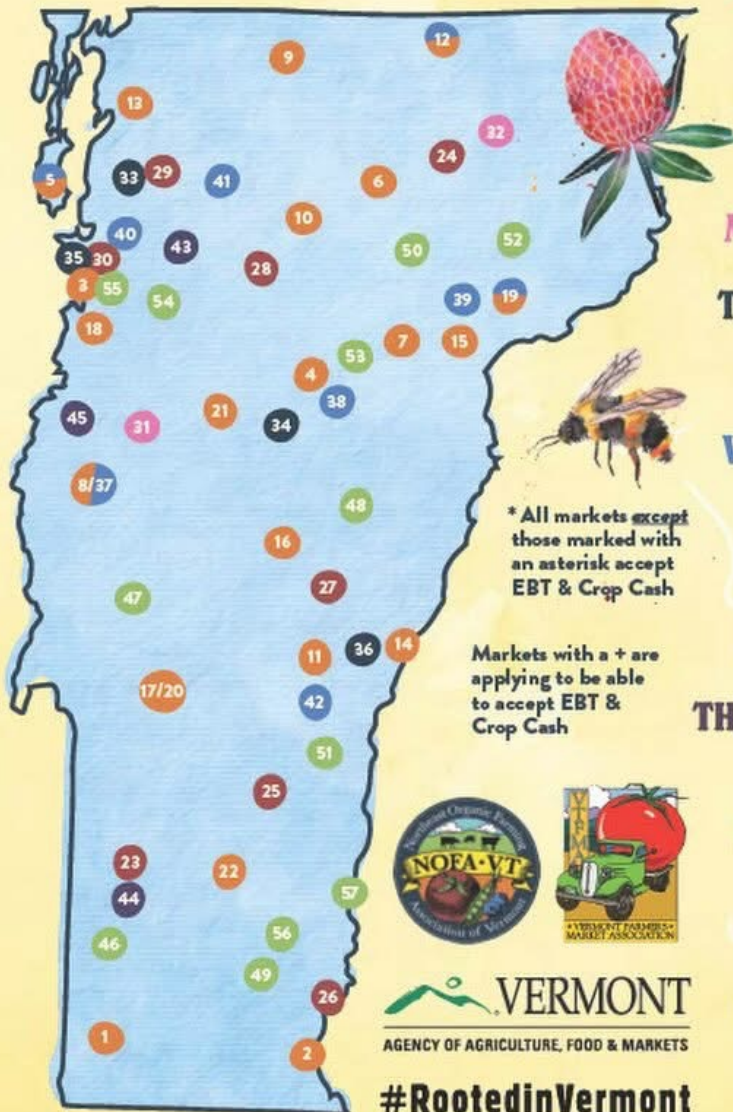

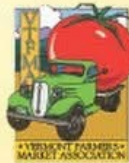
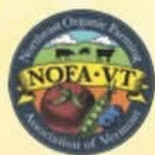

Cleaning up Public Spaces -- Ready for Spring!

Londonderry, VT. May 20, 2026: Every year in early May the Green Mountain Gardeners fan out in the Mountain Towns to clean winter debris from local public gardens to get ready for spring.

In recent weeks the group has tended the gardens at the Farrar-Mansur House in Weston, the Landgrove Meeting House, and the raised beds at the Rescue Squad in Londonderry. A few years ago the group created the doorway garden at the Custer Sharp House, home to the Londonderry Arts and Historical Society, and keeps improving it annually, too.

This public garden work is an important part of the club's commitment to community service. In 2025, the club was proud to be recognized for this annual work with an award from the Federated Garden Clubs of Vermont, its parent organization.

The Green Mountain Gardeners fosters horticulture, beautification and conservation in the mountain towns of Landgrove, Londonderry, Peru and Weston. Living with Black Bears

It's that time of year, Vermont! We're getting reports of bears waking up and leaving their dens all over the state, which means it's time to take down those birdfeeders and bearproof your yard.

While early April is traditionally thought of as bear-aware time, shorter winters mean bears emerge from their dens earlier in the spring. Don't wait until a bear comes to visit your property to take steps to prevent a bear incident. Here are some steps you can take now to help teach bears, and other wildlife like raccoons, skunks and rodents, that our yards and neighborhoods are not where they should come looking for a snack:

- **Take down your birdfeeders until next winter**
- **Keep your garbage in bear-resistant containers or structures. You can contact your waste hauler to see about getting a bear-resistant dumpster!**
- **Get your chickens and bees behind electric fencing or a bear-proof enclosure to keep them safe**
- **Visit our website to learn more about composting in bear country**

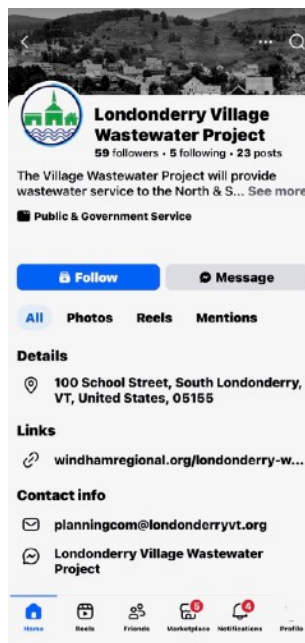

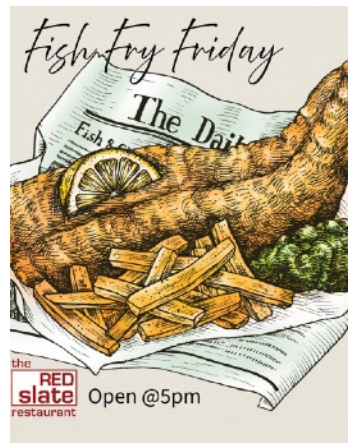

Help Create the Londonderry Arts and Historical Society's 250th Commemorative Quilt!

The Londonderry Arts and Historical Society (LAHS) is inviting community members—quilters and non-quilters alike—to help create a special community quilt celebrating Londonderry's 250th anniversary.

The theme is simple: **“What does Londonderry mean to you?”**

A centerpiece for the commemorative quilt has already been designed by LAHS's artistic Collections Manager, and volunteers are ready to assemble the finished work. Now LAHS is seeking community participation through the creation of individual quilt squares that reflect personal connections to Londonderry and the people, places, and memories that make it meaningful.

Square designs can feature local landmarks, scenes from nature, or aspects of community life. Participants may also include meaningful words or phrases, family names, important dates, organizations, or short quotations. Squares can be embroidered, decorated with fabric-safe markers, or created using other artistic techniques.

No quilting experience is necessary. LAHS has supplies available for anyone who would like to create their square on site.

As completed squares are submitted, they will be displayed in the Society's Marble Room, allowing visitors to watch the commemorative quilt grow over time.

Quilt kits, which include fabric and instructions, are available for \$20, with proceeds benefiting LAHS. The deadline for submitting completed squares is **Labor Day**, and the finished quilt will be unveiled during a community celebration over **Columbus Day weekend**.
