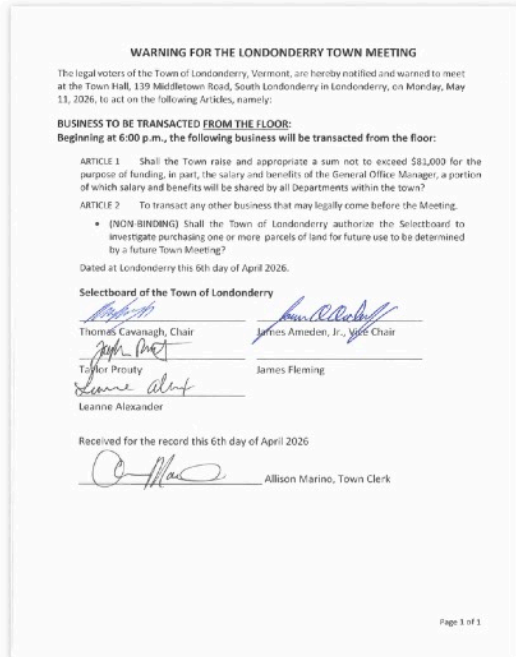

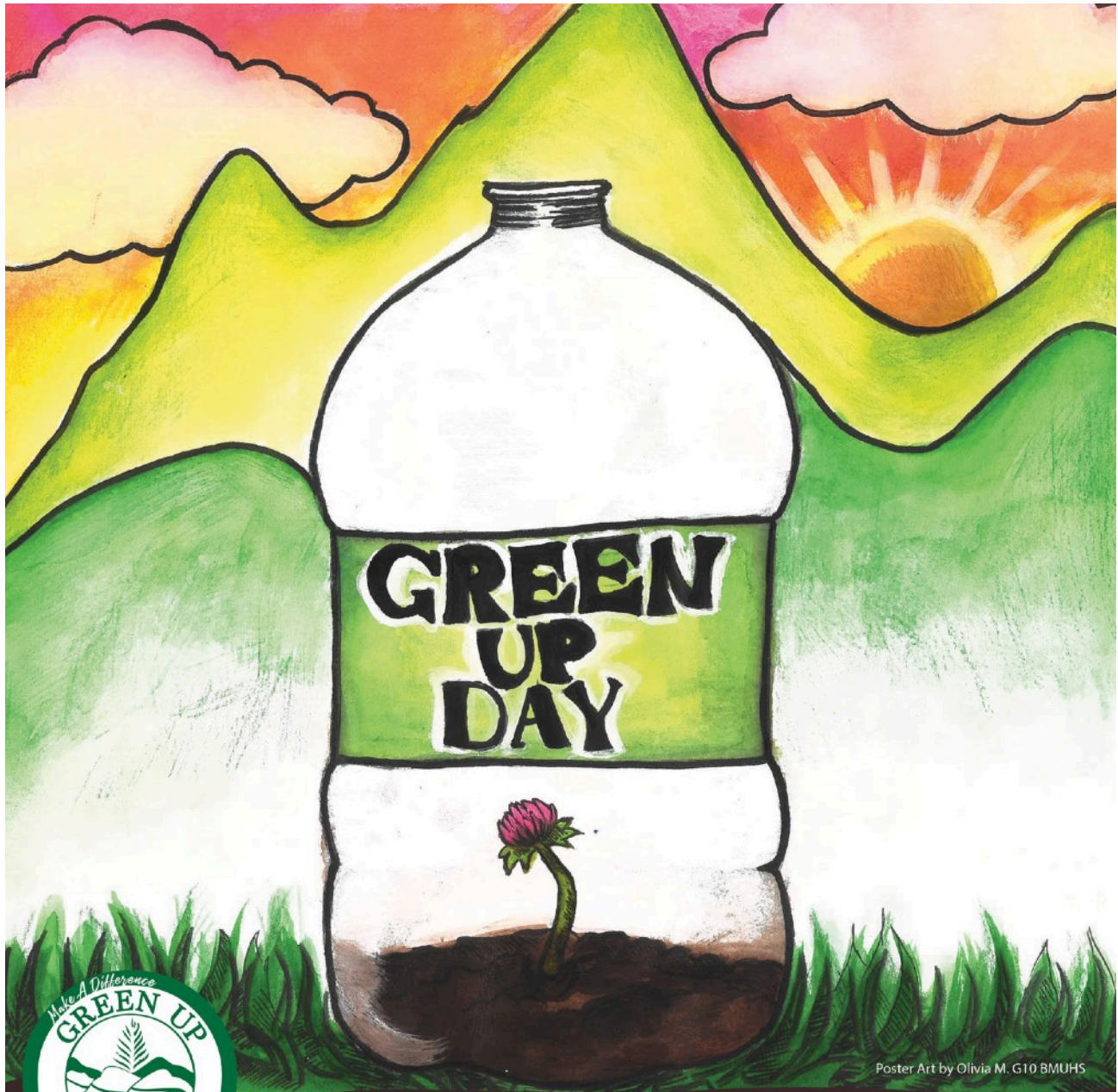

The Municipal Office Manager supports all departments within the town. This position is a key role requiring excellent customer service skills. Daily tasks include but not limited to:

- Provide administrative support to the Town Clerk and will act as Town Clerk in Town Clerk's absence.
- Greet and welcome the general public and field/direct phone calls and walk-ins with an emphasis on excellent customer service.
- Complete certification and perform notary duties.
- Issue a variety of licenses, permits and certificates (birth, marriage, death, dog, posted land, green mountain passport, DMV Renewals, Hunting & Fishing Licenses).
- Reconciliation of cash drawer and bank statements; processing pay orders for the Treasurer.
- Distribute mail to town staff, including date stamping mail when received.
- Provide assistance and support to lawyers, real estate brokers & homeowners researching land records.
- Support elections including but not limited to check-in absentee/early ballots, act as deputy presiding officer at all elections and assist in all election related processes.
- Assist in management of land records
- Digitize Land Records
- Digitize Zoning Files & Lister/Assessor Files
- Maintaining Office Supplies and any other building supplies
- Assisting all other departments (Zoning, Parks & Rec, Assessors Office, Town Administrator, Treasurer & Delinquent Tax Collector, Highway Foreman, Short Term Rental Coordinator & Solid Waste Manager) with general office duties including, but not limited to: Filing & Digitizing, Mailing, Billing.
- Assist Treasurer with newly formed wastewater department in billing and collections.

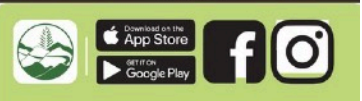

Winhall "100% Campaign" Launches April 28

From the end of April through the end of May, Neighborhood Connections will be undertaking a targeted effort to enable residents of Winhall to take advantage of the many financial benefit programs to which they may be entitled, but unfamiliar with, known as a **"100% Campaign."** Neighborhood Connections can help with advising, completing applications, handling delivery to the appropriate federal or state offices for processing, and follow-up. Programs that can be explored include 3SquaresVT (SNAP benefits), Seasonal Fuel Assistance, Medicaid, Medicare Savings Programs (including Vermont's prescription "V-Pharm" plan), Green Mountain Power discounts, and more.

Wellness Classes

Tai Chi for Falls Prevention - Do you worry about falling? The fear of falling often results in more falls; hence, confidence in “not falling” helps reduce these incidents. Tai Chi is a gentle movement exercise that improves balance by strengthening muscles and coordination. With regular practice, tai chi is a highly effective exercise for fall prevention. All of our instructors are certified through Tai Chi Vermont.

Bone Builders - The RSVP Bone Builders Osteoporosis Prevention and Reversal Program is an effective combination of weight bearing, balance and stretching exercises. Bone Builders is a free, ongoing program with a choice of morning or afternoon classes. Group classes include standing and sitting exercises using light hand weights.

Walk with Ease – Walk with Ease is an evidence-based Wellness Program developed by the Arthritis Foundation. It uses the simple activity of walking to improve health and well-being, and is good for nearly everyone, from absolute beginners to people who have been active for years. This is a year-round program, with walks outdoors in pleasant weather, and indoors in the winter courtesy of our partnership with the Chris Lewit Tennis Academy.

Living with Black Bears

It's that time of year, Vermont! We're getting reports of bears waking up and leaving their dens all over the state, which means it's time to take down those birdfeeders and bearproof your yard.

While early April is traditionally thought of as bear-aware time, shorter winters mean bears emerge from their dens earlier in the spring. Don't wait until a bear comes to visit your property to take steps to prevent a bear incident. Here are some steps you can take now to help teach bears, and other wildlife like raccoons, skunks and rodents, that our yards and neighborhoods are not where they should come looking for a snack:

- **Take down your birdfeeders until next winter**
- **Keep your garbage in bear-resistant containers or structures. You can contact your waste hauler to see about getting a bear-resistant dumpster!**
- **Get your chickens and bees behind electric fencing or a bear-proof enclosure to keep them safe**
- **Visit our website to learn more about composting in bear country**

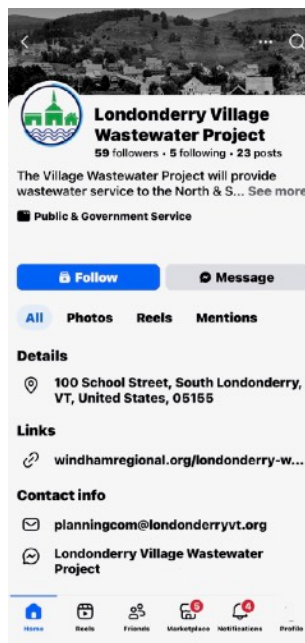

VT-ALERT is used by the state and local responders to notify the public of emergency situations. **Those include, but are not limited to, evacuation information; chemical spills; shelter-in-place alerts; severe weather advisories; boil water advisories; and roadway interruptions.** Residents can tailor the alerts to specific locations, types of alerts, and on which devices they will be notified.

 - Users can prioritize notifications by specifying the order of communication type and method.

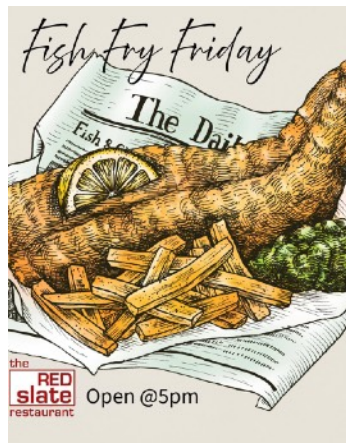

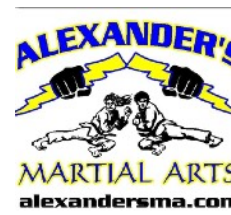

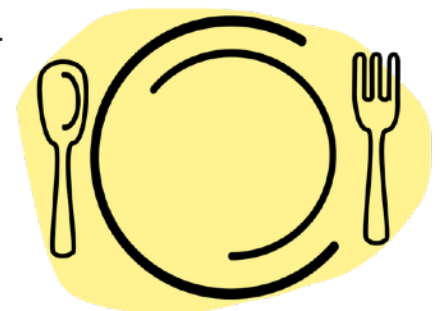
