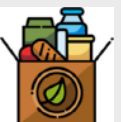
Route 100 South will have ongoing lane closures for the Wastewater Project.  Expect short delays due to daily lane closures.

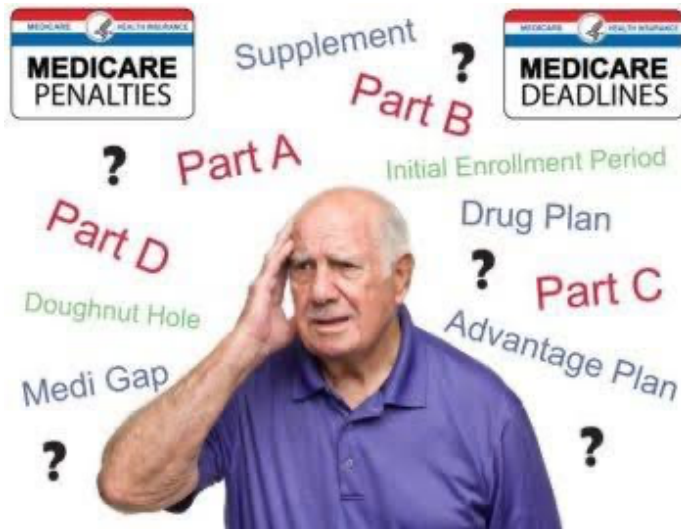

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Grace Cottage Hospital Earns National Recognition for Stroke Care, Heart Attack Treatment, and Patient Experience

TOWNSHEND, Vt. — Grace Cottage Family Health & Hospital has received two major recognitions from the American Heart Association for its commitment to providing high-quality healthcare in a rural setting, underscoring the organization's continued focus on improving patient outcomes and experiences.

The hospital recently earned the **Get With The Guidelines® – Stroke Rural Recognition Bronze Award**, which recognizes hospitals that work to improve stroke care and address healthcare disparities in rural communities. The Bronze Award represents the highest recognition level available to Grace Cottage during its initial participation in the program.

According to the American Heart Association, residents of rural areas are 40% more likely to develop heart disease and face a 30% higher risk of dying from a stroke. Grace Cottage's recognition reflects its efforts to enhance stroke

treatment and reduce those risks for patients in the communities it serves.

In addition to its stroke-care recognition, Grace Cottage Hospital achieved **Silver Status** in the American Heart Association's **STEMI Achievement Award Program**. The designation acknowledges the hospital's success in delivering timely and effective treatment for patients experiencing ST-elevation myocardial infarction

(STEMI), the most severe and potentially fatal type of heart attack.

The hospital's providers earned the distinction by demonstrating a high level of proficiency in meeting national standards for heart attack care and response.

"These recognitions mean a great deal to me because they represent the dedication, teamwork, and commitment our Emergency Department brings to every

patient, every day," said Keanna Cook, Grace Cottage's Emergency Nursing Director. "In a rural hospital, minutes matter during a stroke or heart attack, and our team works tirelessly to ensure patients receive the highest standard of care from the moment they arrive. I'm incredibly proud of what we've accomplished together, which reflects our promise to our community that they can trust us to provide exceptional emergency care when they need it most."

Medical Go-Bags – VT Department of Health Presentation

A Medical Go Bag is a portable kit containing essential medical supplies for emergencies or rapid evacuation.

This presentation will help individuals prepare a personalized, ready-to-use bag to leave by their front door in the case that an ambulance is bringing them to the hospital. This is a great tool for folks of all kinds and ages to prepare, especially those who may experience chronic or new health conditions. This will be supportive in staying organized and ready should an emergency arise.

Individuals and caregivers of all ages are welcome. Bags are not provided. Fillable Medical History documents for the Go-Bag will be provided.

If you don't have copies of important documents (ID, Insurance Card, Power of Attorney, Advance Directive, etc.) you can make them at the library from your originals for your Go-Bag.

Who were their parents and grandparents? What happened to those men, after their military service? Did they stay in their hometowns and raise families, or did they move elsewhere, including the republic which became the State of Vermont?

Michele Pagán is a recently-returned native Vermonter who spent her childhood in Bennington. She is a graduate of the University of VT and University of Connecticut, where she studied clothing & textiles. She credits her early experience visiting Bennington Museum with opening new doors to her, allowing her to envision a unique career trajectory. The Bennington Museum recently published her research entitled Geography and Technological Change in Vermont: The Transition from Homespun Flax To Machine-Made Cotton Textiles.

Today she is a textile conservator in private practice who likes to say that she is "Saving history one piece of fabric at a time."

Having accrued nearly 40 years of conservation experience, her previous clients and employers include the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation, The Smithsonian Institution's Museums of American History and African-American History, the U.S. Department of State, Mount Vernon, Thomas Jefferson's Monticello, the State of Vermont, and the Bishop Museum in Honolulu, HI, among others.

She holds a certificate in Museum Education from Tufts University, and she completed the Smithsonian Institution's online certificate for the C3 Framework for Teaching Social Studies.

She presently works out of her studio in East Dorset.

Michele is currently associated with the Vt Sampler Initiative, and coordinated the statewide Vt Samplers Driving Tour in 2025, in conjunction with the VT State 250th Commemoration of the start of the American Revolution.

She has also become a Certified Genealogist, through Boston University's online certificate program.

She will speak to the South Londonderry attendees on the topic: Some Sampler Stories, based on the research she has done into the Revolutionary War ancestors of the girls who made Vermont samplers. Help Create the Londonderry Arts and Historical Society's 250th Commemorative Quilt!

The Londonderry Arts and Historical Society (LAHS) is inviting community members—quilters and non-quilters alike—to help create a special community quilt celebrating Londonderry's 250th anniversary.

The theme is simple: **"What does Londonderry mean to you?"**

A centerpiece for the commemorative quilt has already been designed by LAHS's artistic Collections Manager, and volunteers are ready to assemble the finished work. Now LAHS is seeking community participation through the creation of individual quilt squares that reflect personal connections to Londonderry and the people, places, and memories that make it meaningful.

Square designs can feature local landmarks, scenes from nature, or aspects of community life. Participants may also include meaningful words or phrases, family names, important dates, organizations, or short quotations. Squares can be embroidered, decorated with fabric-safe markers, or created using other artistic techniques.

No quilting experience is necessary. LAHS has supplies available for anyone who would like to create their square on site.

As completed squares are submitted, they will be displayed in the Society's Marble Room, allowing visitors to watch the commemorative quilt grow over time.

Quilt kits, which include fabric and instructions, are available for \$20, with proceeds benefiting LAHS. The deadline for submitting completed

squares is **Labor Day**, and the finished quilt will be unveiled during a community celebration over **Columbus Day weekend**.

"Every square matters. Together we'll create a quilt that reflects the creativity, history, and heart of our community."

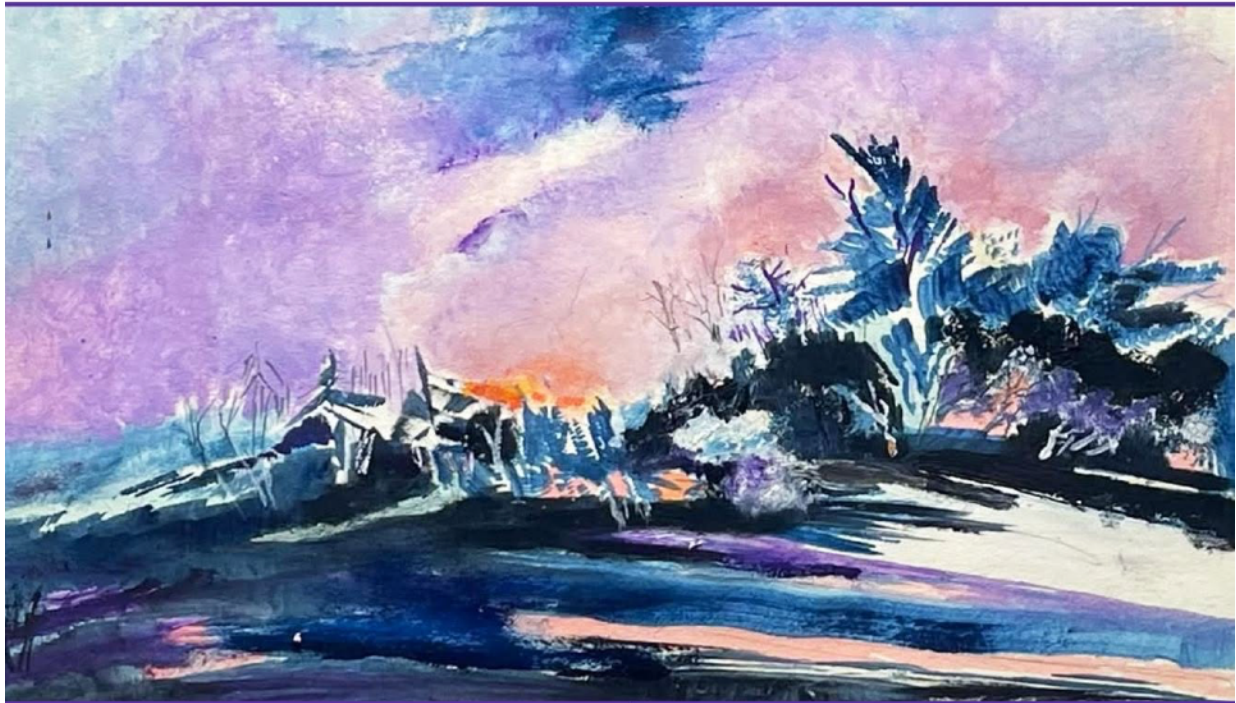

Malian artisans have hand-dyed an exquisite collection of textiles for this Londonderry occasion. Rubia's Open House supports women and families while sustaining Mali's cultural heritage.

Bogolan is a hand-woven cotton fabric colored by fermented mud. Once the mud dye touches the fabric, it leaves indelible color. Artisans apply to the cloth geometric patterns representing the "language of bogolan." The traditional dyeing methods have been handed down from generation to generation of Malians. *Bogolan* has transcended its Malian origins and become a symbol of African culture.

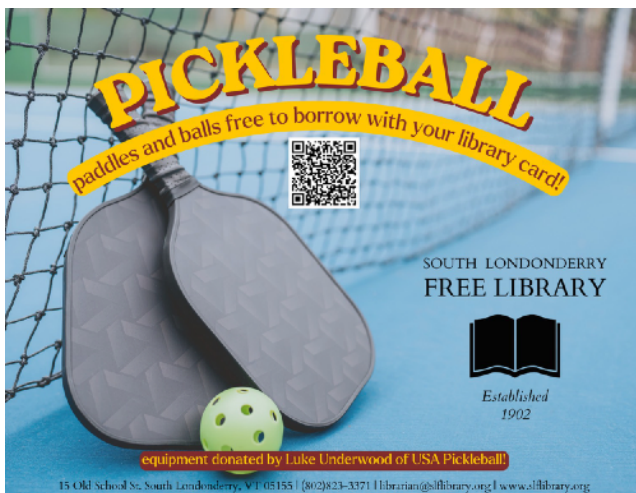

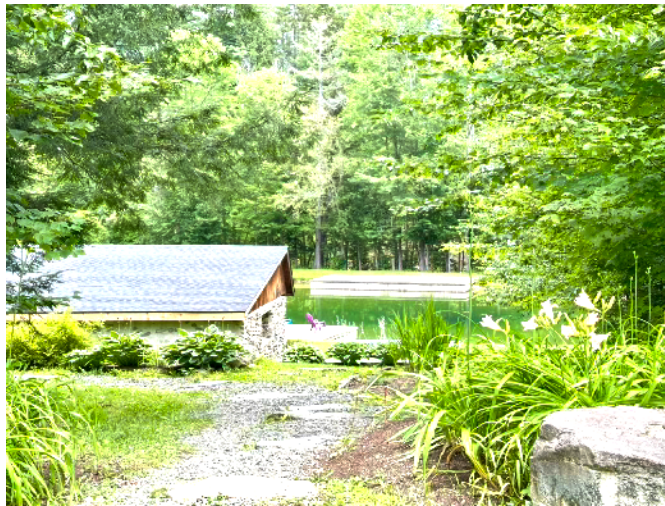

Memorial Park / Rules

Memorial Park

- * Park hours are 8 AM until Dusk
- * No Lifeguard on duty
- * Swim at your own risk
- * No dogs allowed
- * Pack in – pack out
- * No alcohol
- * No smoking
- * No camping
- * Fire in designated locations only



Pingree Park Rules

- * Dogs must be kept on a leash unless in the dog park
- * pack in – pack out
- * No alcohol
- * No smoking
- * No camping
- * No fires
- * Park Hours are 8 AM until dusk

Pingree Park Pavilion, except for Music Mondays, can be used on a first-come, first-served basis.

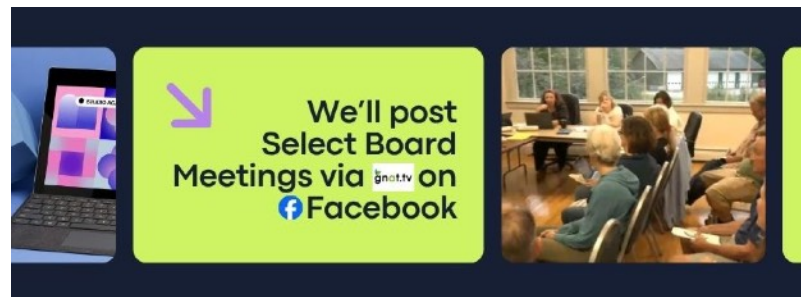

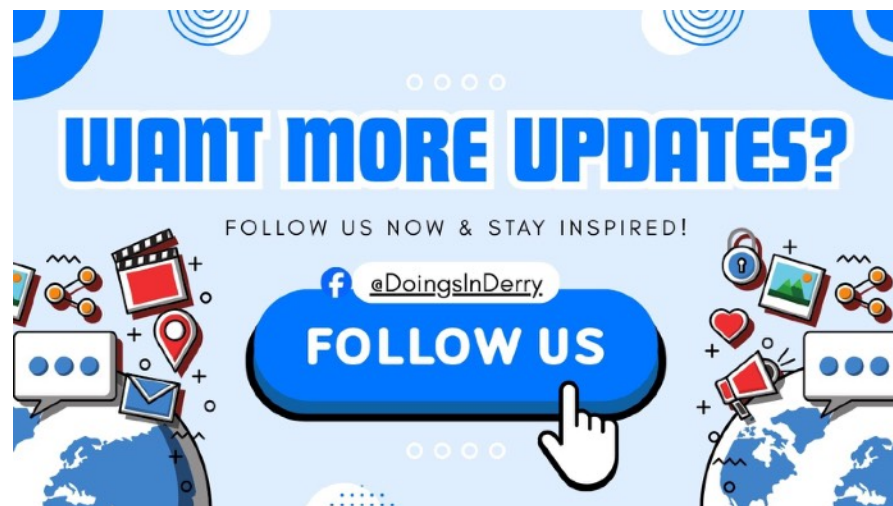
