sides of your home

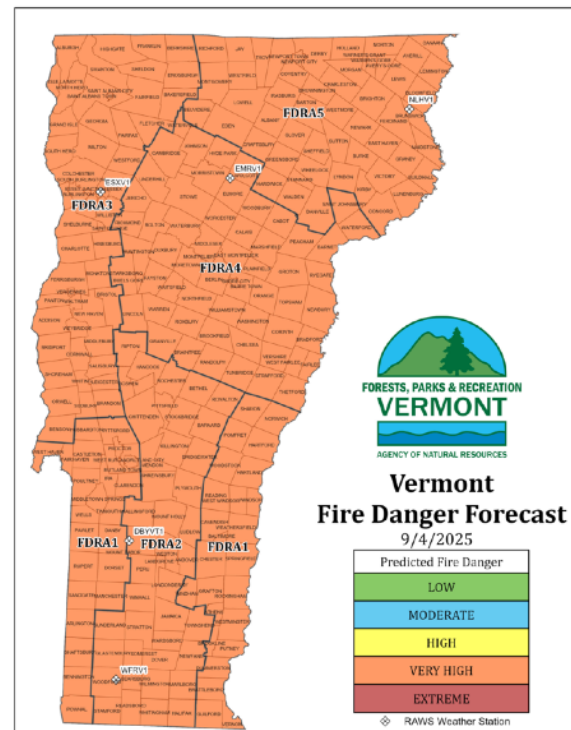

PLANNING COMMISSION MINUTES TAKER POSITION AVAILABLE!

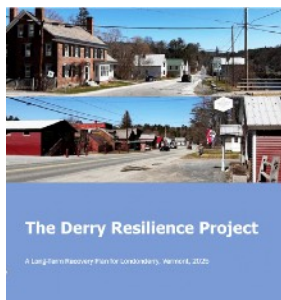

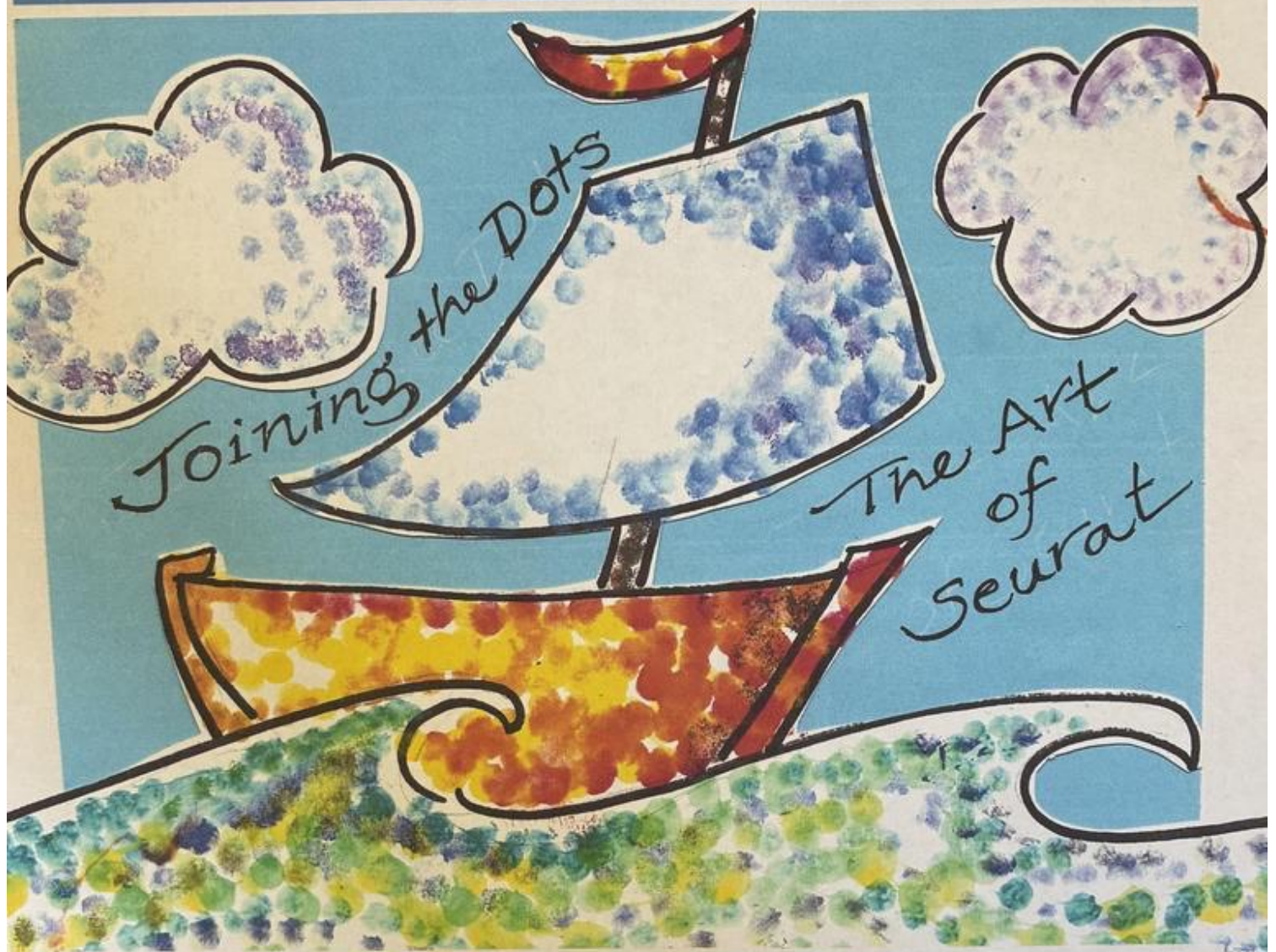

Pingree Park Rules

- * Dogs must be kept on a leash unless in the dog park
- * pack in - pack out
- * No alcohol
- * No smoking
- * No camping
- * No fires
- * Park Hours are 8 AM until dusk

Pingree Park Pavillion, except for Music Mondays, can be used on a first come, first serve basis.

HOWEVER, if alcoholic beverages are going to be served/used an Application for Use of Alcoholic Beverages in Public Places must be filled out and approved by the Selectboard.

Pingree Park Dog Park Rules

- * Dogs outside the dog park area MUST be leashed
- * Dogs must be accompanied by an adult (human).
- * All dogs must have a valid license and vaccination tag
- * Accompanying adult must maintain control over dogs
- * Accompanying adult is responsible for feces clean up
- * No glass, food, alcohol or smoking
- * No vicious dogs as defined by the Londonderry Dog Ordinance
- * No dogs in heat or puppies under 16 weeks
- * Persons under 12 must be accompanied by an adult
- * users of the park do so at their own risk. All dogs and their owners must comply with the Londonderry Dog Ordinance.
- * The Town of Londonderry will not be liable for any injury or damage caused by any dog or person in the park.



Ordinance Regulating Dogs and Wolf Hybrids

At their 08/18/2025 regularly scheduled meeting, the Town of Londonderry Selectboard adopted an **Ordinance Regulating Dogs and Wolf-Hybrids**. The purpose of the ordinance is to regulate the keeping of dogs and wolf hybrids and to provide for their leashing, muzzling, restraint, impoundment, and destruction, to protect the public health and safety of the Town and preserve the quiet enjoyment of residents' homes and properties. This ordinance supersedes the prior Dog Ordinance.
