

WARNING FOR THE LONDONDERRY TOWN MEETING

The legal voters of the Town of Londonderry, Vermont, are hereby notified and warned to meet at the Town Hall, 139 Middletown Road, South Londonderry in Londonderry, on Tuesday, March 3, 2026, to act on the following Articles, namely:

BUSINESS TO BE TRANSACTED FROM THE FLOOR:

Beginning at 9:30 a.m., the following business will be transacted from the floor:

ARTICLE 1 To elect a Moderator to preside at Town Meeting.

ARTICLE 2 To act on the report of the Town Officers.

ARTICLE 3 To elect all Town Officials required by law:

- Selectboard member for a term of two years.
- Selectboard member for a term of three years.
- Town Clerk for a term of three years.
- Treasurer for a term of three years.
- Lister for a term of three years.
- Cemetery Commissioner for a term of five years.
- Trustee of Public Funds for a term of three years.

ARTICLE 4 To see how much the Town will vote for a General Fund.

ARTICLE 5 Shall the Town vote for its taxes to be paid to the Town Treasurer as provided by law, due date to be on or before October 1, 2026?

ARTICLE 6 Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$37,000.00 for the following organizations?

ARTICLE 9 Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200,000 to be deposited into the Town Buildings Reserve Fund?

ARTICLE 10 Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$410,000 to be deposited in the Highway Improvement Reserve Fund?

ARTICLE 11 Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000 to be deposited in the Pingree Park Reserve Fund?

ARTICLE 12 Shall the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25,000 to be deposited in the Community Economic Improvement Reserve Fund?

ARTICLE 13 Shall the Town raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$81,000 for the purpose of funding, in part, the salary and benefits of the General Office Manager, a portion of which salary and benefits will be shared by all Departments within the town?

ARTICLE 14 Shall the Town of Londonderry vote to authorize the assessment of a one percent (1%) local options tax on sales pursuant to 24 V.S.A. § 138, the proceeds of which shall be applied as General Fund revenue to reduce the municipal property tax rate.

ARTICLE 15 To transact any other business that may legally come before the Meeting.







Wellness Classes

Tai Chi for Falls Prevention - Do you worry about falling? The fear of falling often results in more falls; hence, confidence in “not falling” helps reduce these incidents. Tai Chi is a gentle movement exercise that improves balance by strengthening muscles and coordination. With regular practice, tai chi is a highly effective exercise for fall prevention. All of our instructors are certified through Tai Chi Vermont.

Bone Builders - The RSVP Bone Builders Osteoporosis Prevention and Reversal Program is an effective combination of weight bearing, balance and stretching exercises. Bone Builders is a free, ongoing program with a choice of morning or afternoon classes. Group classes include standing and sitting exercises using light hand weights.

Walk with Ease – Walk with Ease is an evidence-based Wellness Program developed by the Arthritis Foundation. It uses the simple activity of walking to improve health and well-being, and is good for nearly everyone, from absolute beginners to people who have been active for years. This is a year-round program, with walks outdoors in pleasant weather, and indoors in the winter courtesy of our partnership with the Chris Lewit Tennis Academy.





New Wellness Program - Snowshoeing for Seniors!

As a result of a new "Exercise is Medicine Community Wellness Grant by the Vermont Governor's Council on Physical Fitness & Sports, Neighborhood Connections is able to offer a brand new, limited program to help seniors learn the basics of snowshoeing at Viking Nordic Ski Center in Londonderry at no cost to participants!

Outings start and end at Viking Nordic, and will take place on four Fridays: Feb 20, Feb 27, March 6, and Mar 13, weather permitting, from Noon to 3 pm. About half of that is actually a professionally guided walk on 1.5 mile trails. Specific trails will be chosen based on the abilities and interests of the group. The remainder of the time is meant to get you fitted and set up in snowshoes (provided free), and to give you time for coffee, soup, or a sandwich at the ski shop afterwards. Restrooms are available. You may sign up for one, several, or all four sessions.

This is the perfect way to get your exercise while unable to engage in normal walking activities due to icy conditions, and to learn a new activity.

Each session is limited to 12 individuals, so please reserve a spot early by calling us at (802) 824-4343. Liability releases will need to be signed at your first session. If in doubt if this is appropriate for you, check with your medical provider.

SKI TUNING SERVICES

Winter is pretty long here in Vermont, so we're adding ski services to expand our menu during the non-bike months. The shop owner, Ben, has been a skier as long as he's been a cyclist – having done both since his age was single digits. We hope to bring the same care and attention to your skis that we've been providing for your bikes.

We offer complete tuning services, including base grinds for flattening and structure, and sharpening of edges to your liking. Our offerings below are hand-tuning services, all done with top-grade tools.

Alpine services are listed first, with Nordic (cross country) below. Backcountry nordic skis with edges will be tuned as alpine skis if edge maintenance is requested.

All sharpening work in the shop is done by hand, with a combination of edge files and diamond hones. We can set custom edge and base angles, or we can just match what's already on your skis. Waxing is ironed-in by hand, hand scraped, brushed and polished. We also will remove kick wax for a fresh season, and apply new base kick wax. We also do base repairs, and we've got a machine to grind bases as needed or requested.



If you are interested in helping out in your community, now is your chance. **The Londonderry Volunteer Rescue Squad** is holding a Vermont Emergency First Responder course at the LVRS squad building, 6068 Vermont Route 100 in Londonderry, beginning Saturday, March 7.

To be eligible for this VEFR certification course you must be at least 16 years old.

Taking the VEFR class is a perfect way to introduce yourself to Emergency Medical Services and its culture. The primary focus is to learn how to initiate immediate life-saving care to critical patients.

A certified VEFR will have the skills and knowledge to provide life-saving interventions while waiting for additional, and more skilled, EMS personnel to arrive. A VEFR will also be able to assist higher-level personnel at the scene and during transport.

The course will be taught in-person over three days:

- **Saturday, March 7:** 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.;
- Sunday, March 8: 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.;
- Monday, March 9: 6 to 9:30 p.m.

Some of the skills taught will be:

- Administration of cardiopulmonary resuscitation
- Use of an automated external defibrillator
- Control of minor and severe bleeding
- Epi-pen administration
- Naloxone administration

A fee of \$60 is payable to LVRS. This will be reimbursed to those who become VEFR certified and full members of LVRS. To enroll and for more information about the course, **click here**. The registration deadline is Thursday, March 5.

How To Raise Edible Fruits and Berries' March 2 in South Londonderry

Green Mountain Gardeners invites the public to attend a discussion on raising fruits and berries in the home landscape at 4 p.m. on Monday, March 2 at Rugg Valley Greenhouse, 968 Haven Hill Road, South Londonderry.

The program will be led by Mark Wright, owner of Rugg Valley Landscaping. Attendees are asked to bring their own folding chairs.

Wright will speak from his experience and give some practical tips for growing fruit trees and berries and how to best use them to enhance the home grounds. He has had a passion for plants all of his life. Although Wright grew up in New York City, his family spent every free moment in Vermont, which usually involved lugging plants and produce back and forth.

In high school he was in charge of the school greenhouse as part of the school's work program. It was his first experience working in a controlled growing environment and it was an eye opener. Wright majored in Landscape Architecture and Horticulture at Cornell University, where his interest in plants and landscape design flourished.



After graduating in 1974, he and his wife Sunny joined the back-to-the-land movement, built their cabin in the woods and started Rugg Valley Landscaping.

VT-ALERT is used by the state and local responders to notify the public of emergency situations. **Those include, but are not limited to, evacuation information; chemical spills; shelter-in-place alerts; severe weather advisories; boil water advisories; and roadway interruptions.** Residents can tailor the alerts to specific locations, types of alerts, and on which devices they will be notified.





